Brook Ridge Communication Committee—Condensed Minutes—Meeting of Feb. 7, 2018

List of Service Providers – Jensen’s continues to update a list of contractors or service providers who have worked with residents and who do a good job. Please forward any information you have to Tom. The list will be posted in the mailroom and is available by contacting Jensen’s.

Traffic light on Rte. 3 - Jensen’s wrote to the Administer of the Bureau of Planning and Community Assistance asking the State to install a light at the intersection of Rte. 3 and either Dartmouth or Hunt streets. So far, there has been no response. John Cooperider has collected numerous signatures of Brook Ridge residents on a petition requesting the same. He’ll deliver this to both Town officials and the Hooksett Representative to NH Legislature.

Electrical outlets in the Community Building – During a recent resident get together, there was a problem with the circuit breakers not being able to handle numerous heating appliances. There are separate circuits on the north and east walls of the room. Utilizing the outlets on the two walls should alleviate the problem.

New TV – It was suggested to hang the new TV on the wall so it is higher and more easily seen by a group.

Suggestion to install Lights at Pavilion – **There was a suggestion to add lighting to the pavilion.** Tom asked why this was suggested because the few times that there are groups using the pavilion it is usually in the summer when it is light quite late. Adding lighting will encourage even later use, which could disturb those residents whose homes are located adjacent to the pavilion. The Committee felt that this should be tabled, at this time.

Additional Hand Rail - A suggestion was made to install a hand rail from the front entrance to the community room building to the edge of the parking lot. All thought this was a good idea and Jensen’s will install a railing in the spring.
